Tuesday, Sept. 20th **“ABOUT SCHMIDT”** (2002 Comedy/Drama, 125 min. with Jack Nicholson and Kathy Bates) Warren Schmidt is about the taste the not-so-sweet slice of life. When he retired, he and his wife, Helen, had big plans - but an unexpected twist changes everything. Now, all of Schmidt's attention is focused on his daughter's upcoming wedding to a loser waterbed salesman. From meeting the groom's hippie parents to sponsoring a Tanzanian foster child, Schmidt embarks on a search for answers, only to discover that life is full of trick questions.

Tuesday, Oct. 11th **“JULIE & JULIA”** (2009 Comedy, 123 min. with Meryl Streep and Amy Adams) Julie Powell is a frustrated insurance worker who wants to be a writer. Trying to find a challenge in her life, she decides to cook her way through Julia Child's 'Mastering the Art of French Cooking' in one year, and to blog about it. As Julie begins to find her groove as a cook, and her voice as a writer, the project takes on a life of its own.
